



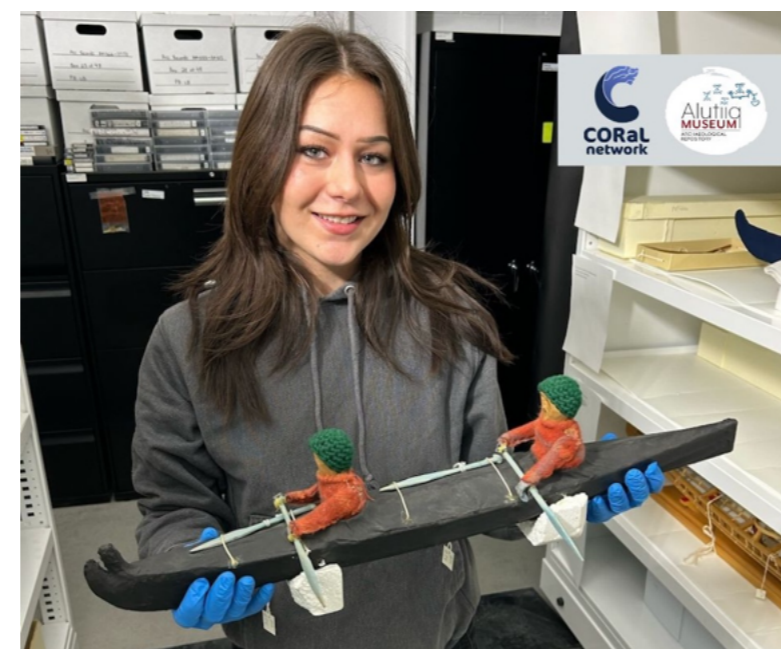
Cama'i – Hello,

Doll Headdress



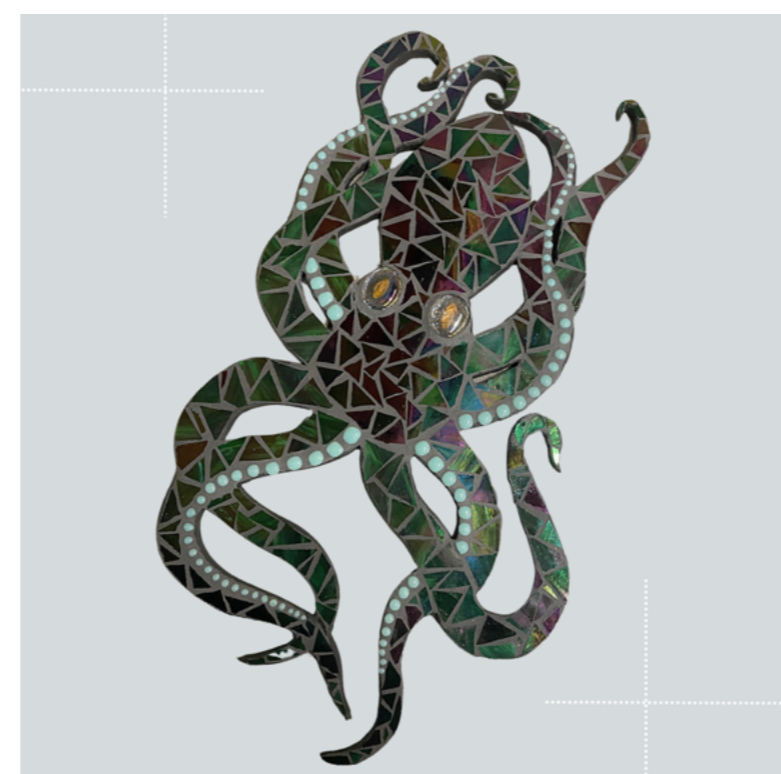
Doll with headdress designed by Kayla McDermott. Parka by Hanna Sholl.

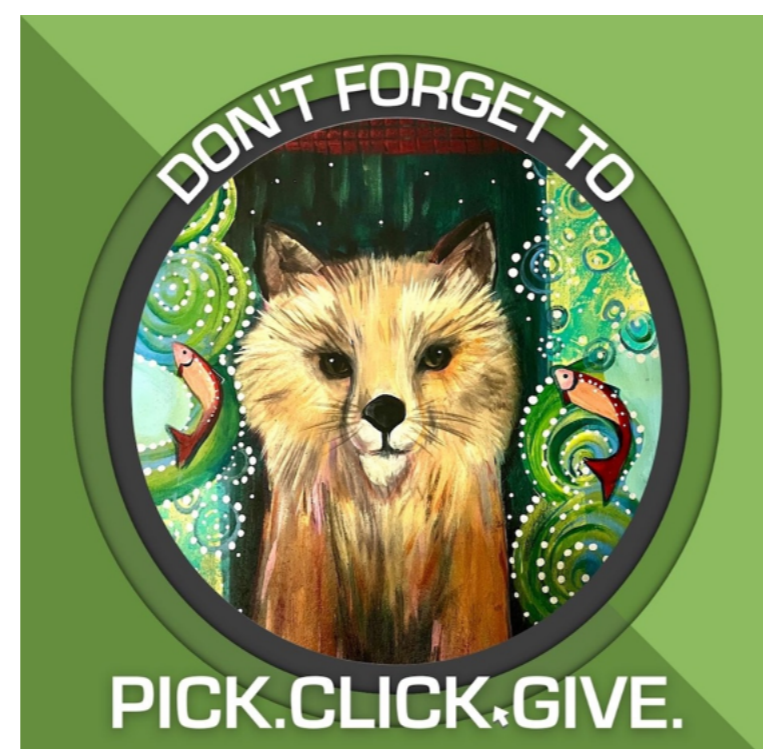
