The Alutiiq/Sugpiaq are an Alaska Native people whose ancestors settled Kodiak 7,800 years ago. We are related to the Native societies of the Bering Sea coast and Aleutian Islands. Like our neighbors, we make a living harvesting from the land and sea.

Today about 2,000 Alutiiq people live in six coastal villages and the City of Kodiak. Many others live in Anchorage, Seattle, and beyond.

Our tribal museum opened in 1995 to preserve and share our culture.
